Transcript of the entry

WENTWORTH

WENTWORTH is a township in Wath-upon Dearne parish, North Strafforth wapentake, Rotherham union, York archbishopric, near the town and station of Wath-upon-Dearne. The population, in 1851, was 1,556, and the number of acres is 2,308. The church here is of great antiquity; the incumbent is the Rev. James Samuel Upton, M.A. The living is a perpetual curacy, value £107, in the gift of earl Fitzwilliam. Here is a Mechanics' Institute, a school for boys and girls, and an Infant school. Wentworth Woodhouse is the seat of the Earls Fitzwilliam, the present representatives of the ancient family of the Wentworth. The population is employed in tillage and in collieries.

THORPE HESLEY is an ecclesiastical district, village, and hamlet, partly in the township of Wentworth, in the parish of wath-upon-Daerne, North Strafforth wapentake, and partly in the township of Kimberworth, in the parish of Rotherham, South Strafforth wapentake, Rotherham union, York archbishopric; it is near Rotherham and Wath-upon-Dearne stations. Here is a district church, the district of which was constituted by Order in Council, 31st December, 1841; and in 1851 contained a population of 1,924, namely, 1,190 in Rotherham parish, 384 in Wath-upon-Dearne parish, and 350 in Ecclesfield parish. Here are collieries. Bolts, nails, and screws are made here.

BARROW is a hamlet, as are Barley Hall and Hood Hill. Thorpe Hesley is partly in this township.
