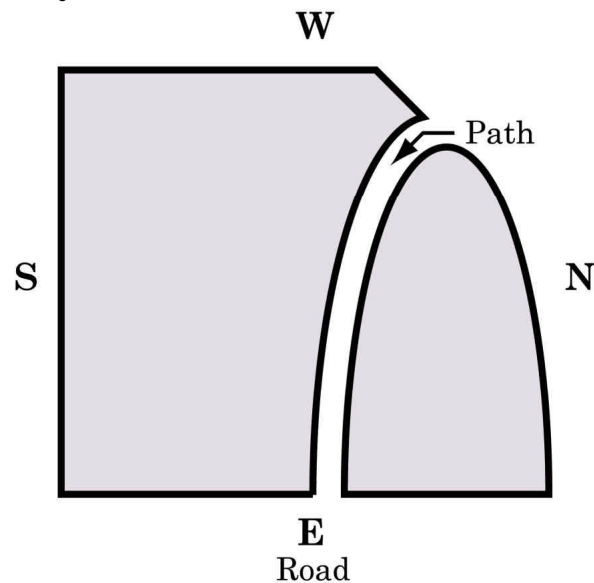


Monument Inscriptions in Campsall Old Cemetery

Copied by L. Smith, April and May 1974.
This transcript made by L. Smith June 1981.

This Cemetery has since been landscaped and many of the memorials have been removed or re-sited.

Rough plan of Cemetery:



The order of the graves as copied and as transcribed below, commenced at the Southwest corner of the area South of the path (left to right) along each row. The area North of the path was then copied in similar order.

The following record was abbreviated to give essential details only:

Ages- "years" inferred unless "months" stated.

Dates standardized- e.g. 1 Jan 1870.

Versus- the familiar ones are indicated by a few commencing words only.

Bible quotations- chapter and verse only; or the commencing quotation.
